Dear Union Avenue Family,

Greetings in Christ! As we continue in the season of Lent, I pray that you have found some ways to open your heart more fully to God. If you have not chosen a daily spiritual practice for Lent, it's not too late! You might consider a ten-minute morning walk, or a few minutes of morning or evening prayer. Even short practices like these can help you to see God more clearly in the world and people around you.



My son Daniel and I have been reading a beautiful children's

Bible called *The Peace Table* together each night. Towards the end of the book there is a selection of prayers – some for morning, some for evening, and some for different occasions, like going to school, or tough days, or being out in nature. Last night we turned to the evening prayer page, and I asked him to choose a prayer. He ran down the list with his pointer finger, saying "Eeny, meeny, miny, moe, catch a tiger by it's toe," until he landed on one. We read it, and then he wanted to pray another. The second prayer he chose was titled "Glad, Sad, Sorry" – a children's version of Saint Ignatius' Examen prayer. We shared with God and one another one thing we were glad about from the day, one thing that made us sad (in Daniel's case, angry), and one thing we were sorry about (a confession). I told Daniel we should change the prayer's name to "Glad, Sad, Sorry, Help!" We each asked for God's help with something in the coming day (for both of us, it was for patience when we get angry).

This moment of reading scripture and praying together doesn't take much time – maybe 15 minutes total – but I can feel it making a difference, for both Daniel and me. It's an opportunity to reflect together on our day, and on our emotions and our choices. I wonder: Is there someone that you can reflect on your day with? Someone who can pray for you, and you for them – even if it's just a 5 or 10-minute phone call each day? You could do this with your spouse, or a grandchild, or a friend. This is the kind of small practice that I think, over time, can make a huge impact in your relationships – both with the people around you, and with God.

If you decide to try this, please let me know how it goes! As always, I am praying for all of you – for peace, and to know God's love, and to experience Christ's joy, today and always.


