Dear Union Avenue United Methodist Church Family,

Happy Easter! It's been my joy to celebrate Christ's resurrection with you this week. Today, I am looking forward to the next journey we will take together. When I was maybe ten or eleven, I asked my mother why we were United Methodists. I don't remember everything she said, but I will always remember her immediate reply: "Because in the United Methodist church, you don't have to check your brain at the door."

PASTOR'S

I know there is much more to being a United Methodist – particularly that we put our faith into action – but my mom hit on something that has always been important to me. Growing up United Methodist, I always felt it was important to ask questions. I never felt that my curiosity about God and Scripture was being judged.

It would be years before I learned about what many call the **Wesleyan Quadrilateral**: the idea that for the founder of the Methodist movement,

"the living core of our faith [is] revealed in Scripture, illumined by tradition, vivified in personal experience, and confirmed by reason,"

with Scripture being primary, as the revelation of God's love in Jesus is found within it (United Methodist Book of Discipline, page 77). When I learned this and learned that John Wesley was a brilliant scholar with a deep faith lived out in loving service, I felt that the United Methodist Church was truly my spiritual home. I think that God honors our questions, because asking questions is part of being in any real, genuine relationship.

At Union Avenue UMC, our mission statement is that we are

"called to be faithful servants, sharing the good news of God's grace."

To me, this means that we model Christ's love through acts of service, even as we pray and worship and ask questions to grow deeper in our faith. I love the curiosity of this church, and your willingness to embrace people who are at any point in their faith journey.

For six weeks beginning April 7th, we will be journeying through Adam Hamilton's new book, *Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith*. We'll explore some of the biggest faith questions that people ask about – scripture, judgement, justice, suffering, Heaven and Hell, and prayer.

Sometimes I tell new people that on the surface we might not seem like the coolest church on the block, but our church is filled with awesome people who live their faith in loving action – and we *are* super cool, theologically-speaking.

So, my cool friends, here's to the next journey we're about to take! Invite someone to come along! And keep celebrating, every day, the resurrection power of Christ that breathes new life into each one of us, in the good times and in times of struggle. Christ is risen indeed!

A HUGE SHOUT OUT!

AFRICA UNIVERSITY RESIDENCE HALL DEDICATED

Through the generosity of laity and clergy supporting the East Ohio Conference's \$1.5 million Teach-Reach-Bless campaign envisioned by Bishop Malone in 2020, a new residence hall for female students is now a reality on the campus of Africa University. The Bishop Tracy S. Malone Hall of Residence was dedicated February 26, 2024. Union Avenue United Methodist Church generously supported this campaign.

A team of pastors, congregations, and faith communities of the East Ohio Conference was on campus to participate in the dedication of the three-floor, residence hall designed with a commitment to accessibility and inclusivity for 92 female students.

During the dedication, many people expressed deep appreciation for the new residence hall and the contributions of East Ohio Conference to make it a reality. Bishop Malone said, "Education has been and still is a core value of The United Methodist Church. Since the earliest days of the Methodist movement, John Wesley believed education was the key to a fuller, richer life, a pathway for ethical, responsible

living. When I cast a vision to the Conference...it was this vision...that kept us stayed on purpose. Thank you, Lord, for the vision. Thank you, Lord, for the commitment. Thank you, Lord, for Africa University."




